### **Photographic Statement**

The photographic work for **A Treasure Found. New Works from the Brignoni Collection**focused on clarity, form, and attentive observation.

Each object was placed against a black backdrop, allowing its physical presence and sculptural quality to take full focus. Lighting was shaped to enhance volume, reveal surface textures, and trace the unique geometry of each piece.


The visual setting encouraged a sense of stillness—inviting each object to speak through its contours and materials. I approached this work with a method rooted in balance: between precision and intuition, between documentation and visual meditation.

This series offers more than inventory—it presents a sequence of concentrated encounters. The objects remain central, framed in a way that respects their origin while opening space for a renewed gaze.

The process was both technical and contemplative, creating photographs that highlight the quiet eloquence of these rediscovered works.

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
